Commerce Department

The Computer Science Department has actively promoted technological innovation, creativity, and digital awareness among students throughout the academic year 2025-26. Our activities were designed to nurture talent, provide exposure, and encourage participation in both intra-school and external events.

Art and Craft Department: By initiating various programs at the school level, we advanced to new heights, with our students securing remarkable victories. At Metro Fest 2025, we proudly won the Maximum Participation Trophy.
