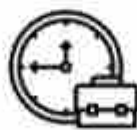

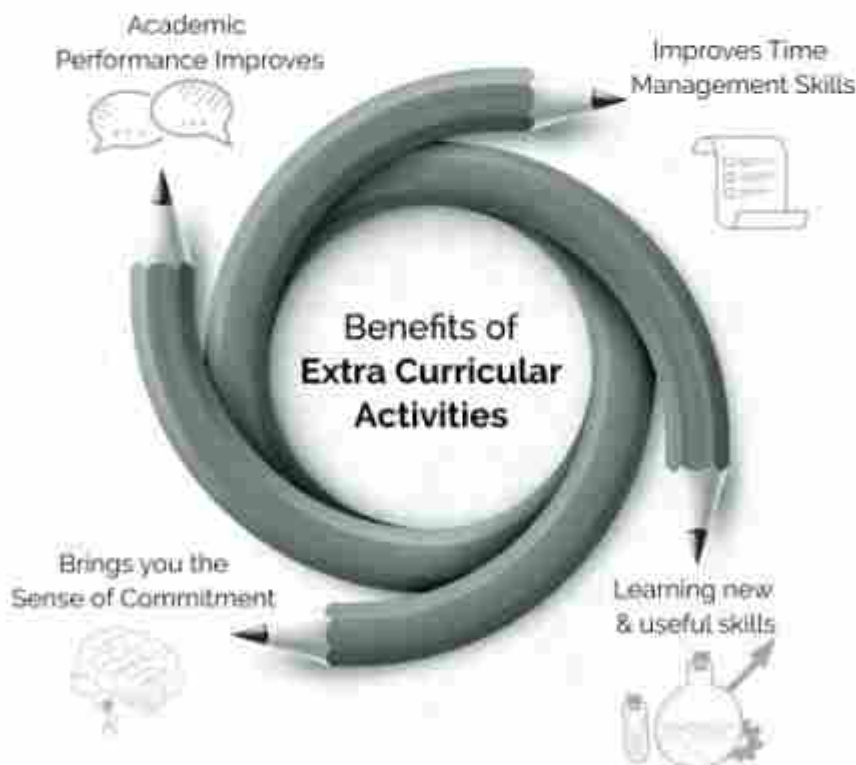

ATTENDANCE

All students should have a minimum of 95% attendance in each academic year so as to be considered for promotion. Unauthorized absence for a period of 15 consecutive days and above will lead to the removal of the student's name from the rolls.

Pupils will not be allowed to leave the school during the working hours. If the pupil is suffering from serious illness, he/she should not be sent to school.

Medical certificate should be produced if a pupil is absent for more than a week due to illness.

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEES

1. Ten months fees can be remitted as indicated below. The fee shall be paid in lumpsum in the first quarter itself or in four quarterly installments

1st Instalment: May, June

2nd Instalment: July, August, September

3rd Instalment: October, November, December

4th Instalment: January, February



First instalment of fees shall be remitted before receiving the text book.

2. PARENTS AND GUARDIANS SHOULD KEEP THE RECEIPTS ISSUED TO THEM AND PRODUCE THEM AS PROOF OF PAYMENT OF FEE, IF NEEDED.
3. The cashier is only the authorized person to collect any fee from the students.
4. Fees should be paid at the school office during school hours Bank with Chellan or through online payment.

ADMISSION REGULATION

1. Admission to L.K.G is to be made in January every year as per the Principals circular.
2. Eligibility for admission to LKG is 4 years as on the 31st May.

New admission to other classes will be made subject to the vacancies in each class, in the month of April / May after announcement of the annual results.

Every new pupil must bring:

- a. Transfer Certificate, if the pupil comes from a recognized school.
- b. The original Panchayat/Municipal birth certificate.
- c. Pupils applying for admission are, as a rule, subject to an entrance examination held at a notified date.
- d. If he/ she comes from school outside Kerala the T.C has to be countersigned by the Educational Officer of the place in which the school is situated or the Regional officer of the CBSE .
- e. New admissions to standards IX & X are as per rules, not encouraged.

Procedure for Withdrawal or Removal from the school

A student can be withdrawn from the school



- a. By giving one calendar months' notice in writing. In the absence of such a notice one month fee will be charged.
- b. Students can be removed from the school on any one the following grounds.
 - i. Constant weakness in studies
 - ii Irregularity in attendance
 - iii Behavioural problems
 - iv Overage in class
 - v Non-payment of fee or chronic irregularity in payment of fee.

School Leaving Certificate (T.C) will be issued only to those students who have settled all their dues in the school. Application for T.C should be made in the prescribed form available in the school office.

LEAVE RULES

1. A student returning to school after recovering from contagious or infectious disease should produce a doctor's certificate of fitness for him/her to attend the class. On failure to produce such a certificate, the school authorities are entitled to send the student back.
2. All students are expected to attend school on the re-opening day, after each vacation. Those who are absent due to illness should present a medical certificate before they are admitted to the class. In case a student remains absent from school for more than 15 days his/her name will be removed from the rolls. Re-admission, if granted, may be done on payment of Re-admission fee Rs 100/-
3. (Compulsory) Parents are requested not to ask their children to leave the school before the classes are over, except in case of great necessity, in which case prior permission should be obtained in writing from the principal.



4. It may please be noted that children will not be sent home in an emergency with any person other than the parent / guardian during school hours without a written request from the parent or guardian.
5. Students who come late, after the stipulated time shall be allowed to attend the class only with the prior sanction of the competent authority. But they shall not be given attendance.
6. Record of absence should be filled in by the parent when the pupil arrives in the class.

Children are advised to be

6. Set apart the morning hours, preferably 4.30 am to 8 am for self-study. Do not allow any private tuition to upset your timetable.
7. All students are required to speak only English at School and in School bus. There are two reasons for this insistence: one, the medium of instruction is English and two, proficiency in this language is indispensable for a rewarding career.

TO THE PARENTS

1. Good education is the joint effort of the school and parent.
2. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline, helping the children in preparing their lessons and by remitting the fees on scheduled dates.
3. If your child brings home anything from the school without the teacher's knowledge, send it back the next day itself and inform about it, to the persons concerned.
4. The school expects parents to visit the school once in a while to meet the principal and teachers with prior permission.
5. All official matters will be transacted only in the school and during office hours.
6. Students are not permitted to bring mobile phone, camera, computer game, pen drive, CD, DVD, valuable ornaments, cash etc to the school campus.



7. Parents are requested to avoid negative criticism of the school and teachers.
8. Intimation from the school must be signed regularly.
9. Parents are not allowed to go to the classrooms and meet the teachers during the class hours without the permission of the principal.

LIBRARY RULES

“Reading makes a perfect man”

1. All students are members of the school library.
2. Strict silence should be observed in the library at all times.
3. Students should not bring any book of their own into the library except their note books and a pen or pencil. A very short summary of the book read must be written in the library note book.
4. Books will be issued to students during the library periods as mentioned in the time table.
5. Any book lost must be replaced or duly compensated fines will be levied for damage to books borrowed.
6. Reference books and other books like the Dictionary, Encyclopedia, ect cannot be taken home. They are to be read only with in the library.
7. Books should be returned on or before the due date indicated on them without fail.
8. Books, magazine and newspapers should not be taken out without the permission of the Librarian.

RULES FOR LABORATORY

1. Silence should be observed while doing practicals in the laboratory.
2. The instructions given by the teacher must be followed.
3. Students will be responsible for any breakage or loss of the apparatus which is used in the experiment. Every breakage or loss should immediately be reported to the teacher.



4. Students shall bring to laboratory proper record books and observation note books and shall record all observations after the experiments are performed.
5. Students will hand over the chemicals and apparatus taken for the experiment to the teacher when the experiment is over. They shall not take out or bring in any chemicals or instruments to the laboratory.
6. Students shall strictly adhere to safety rules & regulations while in the laboratory.

SUGGESTIONS TO PARENTS

Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline, by seeing that the children prepare:

1. Their lessons and by remitting the fees on scheduled dates. They are also expected to see that their children attend school in the prescribed uniform and with the required books.
2. Open houses are conducted for all classes. Parents will be invited individually as and when it is found necessary.
3. All official matters will be transacted only in the school and during office hours.
4. Parents are encouraged to give positive suggestions for the improvement of academic standard. All dues must be cleared before a student is admitted to the terminal & final examinations.
5. Parents shall see the teacher concerned with prior permission of the Principal, from time to time during visiting hours. So that they can have the first hand knowledge of the progress and conduct of the child.



6. Parents are requested not to enter the children's class room without permission.
7. Parents are requested to refrain from asking for special leave to attend wedding of other than the child's own brother or sister or for religious ceremonies, social functions and domestic celebrations as leave for such purpose is normally not granted.
8. Parents are requested to check the diaries of the children every day and ensure that instructions are being followed by their children properly.
9. Improper conduct reflecting character, persistent, irregularity, continued neglect of studies, disobedience, insubordination and disrespect towards any staff member, malpractice at tests and examinations, immoral behaviour and other serious intentional offences are punishable by expulsion.
10. Lunch should be provided to children only in boxes along with a towel for keeping the place tidy. Excess food if any should be taken back home.
11. Please remember that a disciplined child at home will be a disciplined child at school also Take interest in their tests, assignments, and their daily work and also in their co-curricular activities.
12. Fine Rs. 25/- will be levied from the indisciplined students. The amount shall be transferred to charity fund.
13. Entrusting a pupil to the school implies that parents, agree to stand by the rules and regulations of the school and they should see that children also abide by the school regulations.



14. The school uniform is to be worn on all school days. A student who is slovenly dressed may not be permitted into the class room or may even be sent home.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

1. All students are expected to conduct themselves in a disciplined manner at all times and in all places.
2. Classes will begin at 9.00 a.m. and end at 3.00 p.m. Students must reach the school by 8.45 a.m. and they should queue up for assembly. Attendance at school assembly is compulsory. Those who come before 8.45 am should study quietly.
3. When the second bell rings all should proceed briskly in SILENCE for the assembly.
4. Students are expected to speak English in the school premises.
5. Pupil should always be dressed in the prescribed school uniform or sports uniform, wherever applicable informal dress.
6. Students shall greet the teachers, elders and companions respectfully when they meet them any day for the first time. They should show sign of good manners and culture in conversation saying 'thank you' 'please' 'excuse me' 'yes teacher' etc. according to the occasion, as the school is judged by their conduct.
7. Students shall be responsible for the safe custody of their belongings. As a precautionary measure, it is suggested that they have their names inscribed on articles like tiffin carriers, umbrellas, school bags, pencil box etc. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of article of students.



8. Lost articles must be claimed from school office within a week, after that period, unclaimed articles will be disposed off. In case of damage caused to the property of the school, the loss will be levied from the student.
9. Classrooms and the school premises shall be kept neat and tidy. All waste paper must be put in the proper receptacle. Students must make a point of picking up and disposing of litter.
Cycle must be locked and kept only at the cycle stand.
Those who go home by themselves should reach home straight without loitering on the way. Students are warned not to buy anything especially eatables from street vendors.
10. **Mobile phones are not permitted in the school.**
11. **Violation of these rules will invite penalties.**

SCHOOL BUS

1. Pupil should wait for the school bus at their respective boarding point at least five minutes earlier. Loss of bus pass is to be reported promptly to the office. If anybody is found missing at the time of departure of the bus he/she will be responsible for it.
2. No student will be permitted to board the bus without the entry pass.
3. Pupils who fail to remit the bus fare in due time will not be allowed to travel in bus. Bus charges should be paid in advance.
4. The school bus service will be as usual in the morning and evening even on the examination days. Children must enter the bus in queue system.



5. The school bus facility or the discontinuance is not admissible for any part of a term
6. One month's notice in writing shall be given for discontinuance of bus facility. Request for change of boarding points shall be made in writing at least 2 weeks in advance
7. Commuting by school bus is an occasion for the pupils to cultivate good habits like patience, forbearance, tolerance, sympathy, team spirit, co-operation and consideration for others.
8. Gentlemanly and exemplary behaviour is expected by the students in the bus and the boarding points where they wait for the bus.
9. Any student found using foul language or caught fighting in the bus shall be suspended from using the school transport. In order to maintain order and discipline in the bus, students are to co-operate with the conductor
10. An amount equal to two months bus fee to be paid in the beginning as advance. Those who discontinue the school bus facility will lose the advance.

AMENDMENT OF RULES

It is therefore imperative that institutions empower themselves by leveraging technology appropriately to meet the challenges of the future, with a view to achieve the boon of technology.

5. COMPETITIONS

The school helps the students to explore all possible opportunities to participate in inter-house, inter-school, regional and state level competitions. But the expenses and the risks of all competitions except the inter-houses must be borne by the students and parents.
