

A DAY @ ST . MARY'S BETHANY SCHOOL , KARIMBA
ANNUAL REPORT 2025 – 2026

- Daily school begins at St. Mary's Bethany at 8 am. Students of classes 9 and 10 have special morning sessions.
- Regular session begins at 9.15 am. We have rosary in the prayer room from 8.45a.m. to 9.10 a.m., followed by teachers' prayer. At 9.20 am School assembly starts.
- On Wednesdays assembly language is mother tongue. On every Friday, for assembly the medium of communication is Rashtra Bhasha. On all other days of the week, assembly is conducted in English Language.
- Soon after the assembly, 5 minutes is allotted for meditation ,in order to refresh the mind and soul of the students and staff.
- The first Period commences at 9.40 am. We have 8 periods in a day. At 11.10 am we have the first recess for 10 minutes. Lunch break is for half an hour, soon after the fourth period. Before the 5th period, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited.
- The 6th period ends with 5 minutes reading time and it is followed by recess. The prayer of Divine Mercy is recited during the 7th period. School leaves at 3.45p.m..

❖ **TEACHERS' TRAINING PROGRAMMES : (13/5/25)**
